**AAPD Scholarship Recipients Complete the 2015 ADEA/AAL
Institute for Teaching and Learning**

ATLANTA, GA – For the eighth consecutive year, the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD) has provided scholarships to pediatric dentists to participate in the ADEA/AAL Institute for Teaching and Learning (ITL). The Class of 2015 consisted of seven AAPD scholarship recipients for a total of 46 AAPD ITL scholars since 2008. Created for early- and mid-career faculty and private practice dentists who are interested in academia, the ITL is an intense professional development program administered by the American Dental Education Association (ADEA) and the Academy for Academic Leadership (AAL), a US-based consultancy in health professions education.

The ADEA/AAL ITL facilitates the recruitment and retention of dental faculty by helping participants to enhance their teaching skills and develop other competencies that will increase confidence, job satisfaction, and professional growth in the academic environment.

“ADEA congratulates the AAPD scholarship recipients as well as all of the other participants of the 2015 ADEA/AAL ITL,” says ADEA President and CEO Richard W. Valachovic, D.M.D., M.P.H. “Knowing how people learn and what teaching techniques work best is a continuous process and fundamental to our mission in dental education. The growth and popularity of the ADEA/AAL ITL program demonstrates the commitment of academic dental institutions and their faculty to excellence in the profession and to fostering leadership.”

The 2015 ADEA/AAL ITL class included 85 participants from dental schools and clinical institutions as well as private practices. Participants learn the skills of a master teacher from renowned experts in pedagogy, curriculum development, higher education administration and leadership. The program occurs in two-phases over six-days, with a between-phases assignment. Participants in the ADEA/AAL ITL earn 50 continuing education units.

“The ADEA/AAL ITL has 560 alumni since its launch in 2006,” says N. Karl Haden, Ph.D., President of AAL. “We’re especially proud of the achievements demonstrated by the scholarship recipients during the course of the program and look forward to the contributions

of the 2015 AAPD scholars. Surveys show that the program will prepare them with teaching skills necessary to understand and communicate with today's students, and 99% of graduates report a positive or highly positive experience with the program.”
